Camp Information

Camp is packed with lots of fun and excitement! It's a great place to meet new friends and learn new skills. Trained staff provide a safe, secure and structured environment where children can develop their own potential, self-confidence and sense of responsibility. This is accomplished through a variety of social, educational, cultural and recreational activities. As always, we've got some terrific trips and events planned too. Arts & crafts, co-operative games, swimming, theme days and a lot more will keep your children busy all week long!

Our programs are open to all children and families. We offer a minimum of eight subsidized spaces each week to support families needing financial assistance. Please contact us for details; additional information is included in this package.

We strive to accommodate all children to the best of our ability. If you have questions or concerns about your child's participation, please contact us before registering so we can discuss available supports.

Location:

Weeks 1-8: Applegrove, 60 Woodfield Road (inside the Duke of Connaught P.S.).

Week 8: Toronto Formosan Presbyterian Church (31 Eastwood Rd.).

Lunches: A healthy afternoon snack is provided but lunch is not. Please send a NUT-FREE lunch and a drink every day. Lunches will not be refrigerated and glass bottles and containers should be avoided.

Behaviour: We strive to create a safe and welcoming environment. Serious behaviours such as kicking, punching, racial & discriminatory slurs and verbal/physical threats are completely unacceptable at our camp and may result in suspension for the rest of the summer. See attached Rules & Expectations.

Fees:

- \$200 per child per week.
- After-Care: An additional \$20 per child/week.
- Limited subsidies are available. Please see attached subsidy information for full details.
- Full payment is required at time of registration.

Late Fees: Pick up is no later than 4:30 pm for regular hours. 5:30 pm for After-Care (late fees will apply at a rate of \$1/per minute).

Refund Policy:

- All refunds and changes are subject to a 50% cancellation fee per week.
- Fees are non-refundable for unexpected short-term closures (2 days or less) beyond Applegrove control e.g. TDSB school closures, inclement weather, etc. This helps ensure that costs we have already incurred or are committed to pay for can be covered.

Date: Tuesday, February 3, 2026

Location: Applegrove, 60 Woodfield Road (Inside the Duke of Connaught Public School).

Lottery Registration Period: 6:15 – 7:00 PM.

Registration Period: 7:00 - 9:00 PM.

This year we will be registering in-person using a lottery system. Please arrive between 6:15 - 7:00 PM to complete your registration forms (if you completed your forms in advance, please bring a printed copy) and receive a number for the lottery draw. Anyone arriving after 7:00 PM will be added to a wait-list to register after the lottery is complete. When your number is called you will be asked to complete your registration and pay in full for any available weeks you would like to register for.

If any spots remain after the in-person registration, we will post the availability on our website. We will accept registrations on a first-come-first-serve basis after 10 AM on Thursday, February 5th. Registrations sent before 10 am on February 5th will not be considered. Registration Forms not filled in completely with accurate information will be sent back to you and you will be registered when we receive the updated form. A confirmation email will be sent to you confirming which weeks you are accepted for. Once your acceptance is confirmed you will be notified to make your full payment within 3 business days in order to finalize your registration. If payment is not received within this period your registration will be canceled.

Child & Youth Program Rules & Expectations

1. Children will always listen to their counsellors. (Not listening/ Disrupting activities is not acceptable behaviour)
2. Children will always stay with their groups.
3. Children will always ask their counsellors if they need to go somewhere or get something.
4. Children will always keep their hands, arms and legs to themselves. (Play-fighting is not acceptable behaviour)
5. Children will always use kind and respectful words. (name calling and swearing is not acceptable behaviour)
6. Children will always be respectful of other people's property (artwork, personal belongings)
7. Children will practice proper hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette (wash your hands with soap and water and cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue or with your elbow).

Behaviours That Could Lead to Suspension:

- ❖ Causing intentional physical injury
- ❖ Running away / Wandering off
- ❖ Property damage/ Touching non-program items
- ❖ Stealing
- ❖ Bullying or Harassment
- ❖ Discrimination (being unfair, harmful or hurtful to others usually because of race, culture, family makeup, physical abilities, age, gender identity, sex or sexual orientation).



Afterschool Child and Youth Program Suspension Policy

We have a Three-Step Suspension System at Applegrove:

First Step: The staff inform the child verbally that they are receiving their First Warning. The child and parents/guardians are spoken to about the behaviours to try and come up with solutions to prevent any further incidents. The First Warning and its circumstances are documented.

Second Step: The staff inform the child verbally that they are receiving their Second Warning. Parents/guardians are called to be informed and will receive a letter stating that their child is on the second step and further behaviours could lead to suspension from the program. The Second Warning and its circumstances are documented.

Third Step: The staff inform the child verbally they are receiving their third and final warning. Parents/guardians will be asked to pick up their child immediately and the child will be suspended from program. The length of which is determined by myself and the Program Manager in consultation with the staff involved.

Please note: Severe incidents can lead straight to suspension, by-passing the three-step system. This decision would be determined by the Child and Youth Coordinator or the Program Director.

Subsidy Information



We aim to make our programs accessible to everyone by providing reduced fees based on household income and household size (number of dependents). To optimize access to this program we have allocated a minimum of 8 camp spots per week for families applying to subsidy.

More spots may be available after camp registration is complete.

How does my family qualify?

Subsidy qualification and amounts are decided based on the charts below. Proof of income (Notice of Assessment) is required.

How do I apply for subsidy?

Based on the family income and size, Jane would pay a subsidized fee of \$80 per week.
